Good Housekeeping

Here are a few general reminders to help keep our neighborhood looking its best!

- 1. Sidewalk repair is the responsibility of the homeowner.
- 2. Shrubs should not extend over the sidewalk.
- 3. Please do not dispose of pets' droppings in wooded or common areas.
- 4. Dumping lawn clippings in wooded or common areas is not permitted.
- 5. Lawns exceeding a height of 8" can be reported to the City of Strongsville. The City will contact the owner of the property to have them cut it. If the owner does not cut the grass, the City of Strongsville will cut it and bill the owner.
- 6. There is no parking on the fire hydrant side of the street.

City Ordinance regarding Noise

Please be mindful of your neighbors when operating any of your powered tools and refer to the City of Strongsville's City Ordinance on Noise below:

Codified Ordinance Section 634.04a (10) Noise

- a.) No person shall do any of the following
- 10) Operate or permit the operation of any mechanically powered saw, drill, sander, grinder, lawn or garden tool, lawnmower or similar device, other than powered snow removal equipment, in residential areas between 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. of the following day on weekdays, before 8:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m. on Saturdays, and before 10:00 a.m. or after 6:00 p.m. on Sundays, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day or New Year's Day, so as to cause a noise disturbance across a real property boundary in a residential area;


