
PINE LAKES HOMEOWNER'S ASSOCIATION NEWSLETTER FALL, 2017

STRONGSVILLE POLICE NEW INITIATIVE

From the Strongsville Police Department:

"The Strongsville Police Department would like to update all of our homeowners associations of some of the agencies new initiatives moving forward this year. The two biggest, are our new approach to combat the opioid/heroin epidemic and new plan to deploy beat officers back into the community and neighborhoods.

The city of Strongsville, Strongsville businesses and faith based community have joined forces to start addressing the drug issues within the community. They have initiated The Safe Passages program, a quick response team, and a three part series on drug and alcohol awareness community forum.

We have also partnered with the Ohio State Patrol (OSP) to free up officers so they can get back into the neighborhoods and off the highway. OSP will take over primary enforcement and response duties on I-71 while Strongsville officers will concentrate their efforts within the community.

Our zone officers do plan to attend your annual Homeowner association meeting, but homeowners should feel free to contact us regarding any other issues you may be experiencing. Remember, the Strongsville Police do offer free home security surveys to all Strongsville residents, and it is a great time to rejuvenate or start a block watch program. If anyone is interested in being a Block Watch coordinator please contact the Strongsville Police Department.
